Wearing Masks in Our Offices is Now Optional



If you are experiencing cold or flu-like symptoms, please wear a mask for the safety of our patients and staff. Thank you!

We will continue to have masks available should you need one If you would like a staff member to wear a mask for your comfort level and potential risk factors, please respectfully ask and they will gladly oblige.

Please note, according to the New York State Department of Health, anyone diagnosed with

COVID is still required to isolate for 5 days, followed by 5 days of continued mask wearing.

Important Update:

Changes to Medication Delivery The Government is Stopping Us from Delivering Your Drugs.

We have an important update regarding the delivery of your oral medications (pills). The government has implemented a new ruling that affects how we provide your prescription drugs.

Here is what you need to know:

- 1. A recent decision by the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS), the government agency that runs Medicare, says we can no longer mail or deliver patient medications.
- 2. Patients are now required to personally visit the clinic to pick up all medications. Even friends and family members cannot pick them up for you.



Please consider contacting Congress and ask them to help fix this change.

- This change is based on a bad interpretation of an old law against doctors from having conflicts of interest. But, it makes no sense that our dispensing medication directly is any different than our dispensing it through the mail.
- 4. Forcing patients to travel to our clinic for every prescription risks disrupting or stopping the care of our sick patients, especially seniors who may not drive, have difficulty with transportation, or live in rural areas.
- The government says patients who can't travel can get their prescriptions from big corporations called pharmacy benefit managers (PBMs). But PBMs often delay or deny care!
- We are working with the Community Oncology Alliance (COA) to overturn this decision. It puts ents at risk, and was also made without following the law for such a large change.


We understand the concerns this decision is causing patients and assure you that we are actively working to address it. You can help by following the directions at the top right of this article. Thank you for your continued trust and support.

APPOINTMENT CANCELLATION/ NO-SHOW POLICY
